TUTOR TIP



If your student has reading aloud as a goal, it is important that both of you realize that reading aloud is a different skill from reading silently; it needs specific practice time to get good at it. Be sure to have a read-aloud section in each lesson. Have the student choose the passages from those he or she might have to read at his or her place of worship or workplace, or choose a children's book to practice reading. Be sure to have your student (or you) invest in a tape recorder (we discussed that in the last issue) to tape themselves reading. You can record the passage yourself and have the student practice reading it aloud at home (a kind of "distance" duet reading!)
